We totally agreed that studying OUTDOOR, connected to NATURE, could be a SOLUTION to make us study better, feel more receptive to each other and more engaged in school activities.

We started with our English classes. Our teacher of English involved us, in a national project contest:" SCHOOL in NATURE"

Our partner encouraged us to create an OUTDOOR classroom with our possibilities and we were able to do it because we are so lucky to have a generous school garden and also a large playground. The second partner was the non-governmental YOUTH COMMUNITIES ASSOCIATION /Association COMUNITATI PENTRU TINERET/ based in Craiova whose aim is to promote community development through lifelong learning educational programmes.

WE worked together with Exchange Volunteer Service volunteers from Spain, Sweden, Albania, Argentina during our English classes or after classes. They came to our school or we had workshops and activities in the Romanescu PARK, after classes. In order to expand our mission and grow the network of partners we decided to be part of the experiential learning programmes that READY FOR LIFE team(teachers, social &cultural animators) offer students, during the summer holiday.Some of us, participated in READY FOR LIFE CAMP, between 22-29 July, in BRAN. Our purpose was to seek new ways to learn and develop our life abilities, to continue our nonformal activities, our learning by playing and continue to explore NATURE and learn more about natural protected areas.





We discovered a magnificent CARPATHIAN natural protected area (one of the 30 National and Nature PARKS in ROMANIA) and visited the interactive museum NATIONAL PARK PIATRA CRAIULUI. We acquired information and abilities in conditions of maximum freedom of expression, playing games and making experiments.
